Conference Introduction :

The phenomenon of climate change is a global phenomenon that does not stop at the boundaries of a specific region or country, but rather is a global phenomenon facing all countries of the world, both advanced and developing alike, although its effects vary from one country to another, as it has direct and indirect effects on human life, health, and the environment.

This phenomenon has received the attention of the international community, which has spared no effort in concluding a series of international agreements, most notably the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change in 2015. Therefore, the United Nations has adopted a program until 2023 to eliminate the effects of climate change based on international cooperation. Thus, countries have held many international conferences to find solutions to mitigate the impacts of this phenomenon.

Climate action is considered a plan outlined by the international community represented by the United Nations and a large group of economic and legal entities to promote a culture of combating climate change, especially at the level of developing countries, in addition to being Goal 13 of the United Nations Sustainable Development Plan for 2030.

Algeria, as a party in the international community and a part of the process, was not far from the impacts of this phenomenon and its interest in it. Algeria's interest in environmental issues in general, and climate change in particular, began in the nineties, especially after the increased severity of the impacts of this phenomenon on development and the economy in general. Like other countries, Algeria still primarily relies on sectors dependent on climatic conditions such as agriculture, the fishing sector, and the tourism sector, putting the national economy at great risk.

Despite being a developing African country, Algeria's level of economic activity is not at a level that places it among the most environmentally polluted countries like the United States and China, as the proportion of greenhouse gases emitted from various Algerian economic activities remains somewhat low. However, Algeria is considered one of the countries that have started to be affected by climate change and its various implications on all levels.

Algeria attaches great importance to the issue of climate change, as it has signed and ratified many regional and international agreements since independence related to environmental protection in general, including those specifically addressing climate change. One of the most prominent and important agreements is the Framework Convention on Climate Change for the year 1992, which Algeria ratified under Presidential Decree 93-99 dated April 10, 1993, and the Paris Agreement on Climate Change for the year 2015, which Algeria ratified under Presidential Decree 16-262 dated October 13, 2016, in an attempt to align its legislation and institutions according to the provisions of these agreements to mitigate the impacts of climate change on it.

Problematic of Conference :

Algeria, as a country concerned with the phenomenon under study, is particularly exposed to the effects of climate change. Its adherence to international agreements on climate change has led to the integration of the provisions of those agreements into national legislation through the issuance of laws and the establishment of institutions that ensure the implementation of its provisions. In addition to developing policies and plans to achieve the desired goal of reducing the impacts and effects of the phenomenon on Algeria at all levels.

Therefore, based on the above, the problem of the forum revolves around the following question: What measures has Algeria taken to harmonize its legislation and institutions with its commitments resulting from its approval of various international agreements to mitigate the impacts of climate change and meet the requirements of the climate action called for by the United Nations?

- ✎ The intervention must be accompanied by the researcher's data (name, title, specialization, academic degree, college and university, phone number, email, intervention title, axis, abstract in Arabic and English containing keywords).
